

The Short/Long Stirrup, Pre-Child/Adult and Children's Medals will have a flat phase that counts for 50% of final score. The Adult, Modified Junior and Junior Medals will see further testing to be determined by the judges for the top riders (number to be determined).

## Schooling Schedule: Schooling over posted course only.

Schooling must be paid in advance on your entry. Horses are limited to one schooling session over the course either Saturday afternoon or Sunday prior to show unless time allows for additional warmup sessions. Additional warmups will be billed at \$25/session.

**Saturday afternoon:** The fences will be set at 18" from 3:30-4pm, 2' from 4-4:30pm and 2'6 from 4:30-5:30pm. **Sunday morning:** 6:00 AM Fences set at 2'6, 7:00 am 2', 7:30 AM Fences set at 18". Show will start at 8 am.

### ADDITIONAL CLASSES

#### **WNEPHA** Horsemanship Class

Open to current junior members of the WNE-PHA who are qualified for and competing in the 2019 Medal Finals at any level. The class will be judged and pinned as two separate classes based on show age of participant: 13 yrs and under and 14-17 (regardless of Medal Finals show level).

There will be two portions to the score of each participant: the numerical score (out of 100 possible points) from the Equitation O/F class preceding the Medal Finals for which the participant is qualified and competing in (Class 1,3,6,9,13,15) will be added to the score (out of 100 possible points) earned on a written exam administered during the Adult Equitation classes.

The questions on the quiz will be based upon the United States Pony Club D Manual for the 13 yrs and under section. The USHJA Horsemanship Quiz study guide will be used for the 14-17 yrs section. Pinning of each section will be based on the sum of the two scores described above for each participant. Participants MUST pre enter on their regular Finals entry form.

Winners of each section will receive a \$250 scholarship to be used for riding instruction through a Professional Member of the WNE-PHA.

#### **WNEPHA 2'6 Hunter Classic**

Open to current junior and adult amateur members of the WNE-PHA. The class will be run as a two round classic and will be judged on performance and soundness; suitability and manners to count. To be scored under the open numerical judging system. Each competitor will jump one round of 8-10 fences at 2'6. The top twelve from the first round will return to show over a different course, in reverse order of their scores in the first round. Scores will be combined from both rounds to determine the winners. Cooler and ten ribbons to be awarded. Riders may not cross enter into 2' section. 3 barn rule applies to entries.

#### WNEPHA 2' Hunter Classic

This class will run in the same format as the 2'6 classic and is open to junior and adult amateur riders of the WNE-PHA who have never shown at fence heights exceeding 2'6. Riders may not cross enter into the 2'6 classic. 3 barn rule applies to entries. Cooler and 10 ribbons to be awarded.

#### **ENTRIES**

#### **ONLINE**

Entries will be allowed online, however a signed form must be submitted in some way prior to the start of the show. This means that a picture or scan of the completed and signed entry form can be submitted to the secretary by email, the form can be mailed to the secretary, or the form may be brought to the final show of the season, the form may be brought to warmups on Saturday, or in the morning of the show prior to the start. #### **PAYMENT**

We are not able to accommodate online payment for this year, but may try to offer it in the future. To complete an entry you must have a payment in the form of cash or check (to WNEPHA) with the secretary prior to your number being given. This can also be mailed, brought to the final show, or brought to warmups or the morning of finals. For full fees please see the entry form.

#### **WARMUPS**

Warmups will be held the afternoon before finals, with the scheduled times subject to change. Any entry planning to warm up on Saturday or Sunday morning must be enter for a warmup, and will be allowed for schooling in the competition ring either of those times. Schooling prior to the show may be limited in the main ring, which may not allow for schooling on both days. The smaller indoor and the outdoor (weather permitting) will be open for warming up throughout the day.

#### **IMPORTANT UPDATES**

#### **COVID PROTOCOLS**

Due to the current rules for Mount Holyoke College, masks must be worn by all individuals regardless of vaccination status while inside an enclosed space. This includes all indoor portions of the equestrian center. We ask that wherever possible social distancing be followed as well, with the understanding that this can be a challenge the way the ring is setup.

#### **FOOD**

Outside food vendors are not an option for this event as they have been in the past, so please plan ahead. Food is allowed at the show, but will need to be brought in on your own. We encourage you to plan ahead and bring drink and food for your group.

#### **AWARDS**

Dress your best! There will be an award for the best turnout for competitors!

#### **STALLS**

In past years we have been able to offer a small number of stalls for the day and overnight however this year we will not be able to offer any stalls.

#### **WALK TROT**

We will be trying out a Walk Trot division at finals this year, fees are reduced for this division.
